COVER: The El Niño-Southern Oscillation (ENSO) overtly influences avian population dynamics around the world. Butler et al. (p. 428) found a more subtle effect of ENSO on birds: the onset of prebasic molt in Black-capped Vireos (*Vireo atricapilla*) and White-eyed Vireos (*V. griseus*) oscillates with ENSO. Molt starts earlier in El Niño (dry) years, and later in La Niña (wet) years in Texas.
