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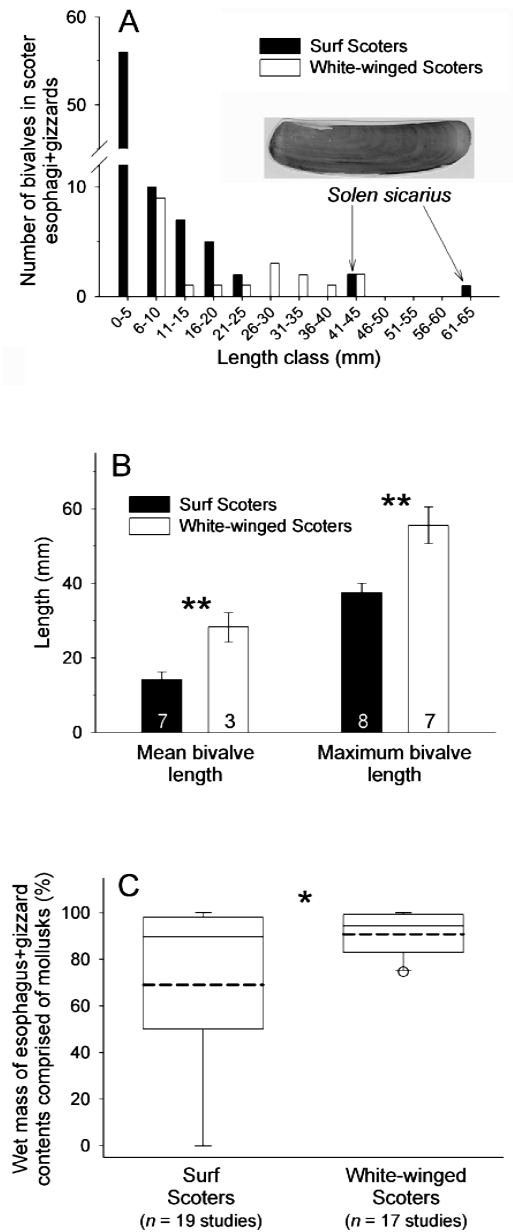
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## ERRATUM



In Condor 110/2 (May 2008), Figure 2 on p. 290 of the paper “Reevaluating marine diets of Surf and White-winged Scoters: interspecific differences and the importance of soft-bodied prey,” by Eric M. Anderson et al. did not print correctly due to a combination of insufficient figure resolution and composition of the original figure. The correct figure appears below. (B) Averages ( $\pm$  SE) across this and past studies (number of studies within each bar) for the mean and maximum lengths of bivalves in esophagus + gizzard contents for Surf and White-winged Scoters. (C) Average percent of diet across this and past studies comprised of hard-bodied prey (mollusks) for Surf and White-winged Scoters. In (C), medians and means are represented by solid and dashed lines, respectively; boxes indicate the 25th and 75th percentiles, and whiskers the 10th and 90th percentiles (the circle is an outlier). \* $P < 0.05$ , \*\* $P < 0.01$ .
