In a long-term study of the species in western Pennsylvania, Mulvihill, Latta, and Newell (pp. 341–348) found that the Louisiana Waterthrush (*Seiurus motacilla*) only rarely attempts to raise two broods, despite being one of the earliest neotropical—nearctic migrants to return to this region. Their study suggests that advantages of two broods are limited by temporal constraints acting through delayed molt as well as by other factors such as prey availability.
