the measurable length. Larger specimens always seem much larger because the greater breadths of thorax and abdomen increase the appearance of bulk. In hand-caught specimens, not reared, the wing length is often affected by damaged wing tips.

The reader may feel that in the keys and descriptions of these flies there is excessive use of such phrases as "more or less," "usually," "commonly," and "sometimes," and the reader is right, more or less! But these reflect the variability that is to be found and the difficulty of making positive statements that will hold true for all available specimens of a species.
