COVER: Remarkably similar plumage patterns often appear in distantly related taxa. Riegner (p. 599) examined the recurrence of plumage-pattern elements across class Aves and their association with morphological features, such as body size and degree of anterior emphasis. He found that streaks and countershading are common in small taxa, but bold patterning, elements of reverse countershading, and exaggerated anterior morphology often appear in relatively large morphotypes, as exemplified in the White-necked Raven (*Corvus albicollis*), among the largest of corvids.
