COVER: Riparian corridors in the southwestern United States support high avian diversity, but have been negatively affected by altered hydrologic regimes and invasion by salt cedar (*Tamarix* spp.). Brand et al. (p. 199) examined factors influencing avian communities along the San Pedro River, one of the last free-flowing rivers in the region. Native woodlands dominated by cottonwood (*Populus fremontii*) or mesquite (*Prosopis* spp.) supported the highest levels of species richness and unique species, including canopy species such as Summer Tanager (*Piranga rubra*). Salt cedar stands had lower species richness and contributed little to regional avian diversity compared with native woody riparian vegetation.
