The Fulbright Arctic Chair

Fulbright Arctic Chair grants are available for researchers/lecturers in fields related to polar and high north issues. The grant will send one Norwegian to the US and one American to Norway for the 2013–2014 academic year.

Grant Activity: The Arctic Chair offers opportunities for research and teaching in collaboration with a host university in fields related to polar and high north issues including (but not limited to) Geology, Biology, Chemistry, Geophysics, Engineering and Environmental Science. In addition, the Chair is expected to engage with faculty inside and outside the institution, give public lectures, hold seminars, supervise Master's and Ph.D. candidates with their research and writing. The Chair will be invited to present at the annual Transatlantic Science Week conference in the United States.

Application deadline for U.S. citizens: August 1, 2012 for the 2013–2014 academic year.

Application deadline for Norwegian citizens: October 1, 2012 for the 2013–2014 academic year.

Qualifications: Ph.D. within academic fields related to polar and high north issues, and 5–10 years of experience.

Chair location in Norway: University Centre in Svalbard (UNIS) or, in close collaboration with UNIS, the University of Bergen Oslo, Tromsø or Trondheim. A letter of invitation is required.

Chair location in U.S.: Any accredited university in the US. A letter of invitation is required.

Length of Grant: 6–7 months within the academic year. Grantee can decide on one term or two terms. The start date has to be agreed upon jointly between grantee and the host institution.

Award benefits: This award provides NOK 100 000 (ca USD 18,000) per month for a 6–7 month grant, covering maintenance and housing. This funding will be offered for a maximum of 7 months, but the grantee may stay beyond the 7-month Fulbright grant period. Additional funding for transatlantic travel and participation in academic conferences will also be provided. There is no financial support for dependents but family members may accompany grantee to the site.
