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A number with keys to the genera of the Strongyloidea and Diaphanocephaloidea is well advanced as is a number with keys to the Cosmocercoidea, Heterakoidea, Seuratoidea and Subuluroidea. The keys to the genera of the Trichostrongyloidea should be completed in 1980.

Each number represents a modern revision of the group concerned by a recognized authority and when completed will be the most up-to-date and comprehensive account of the systematics of the nematode parasites of vertebrates.

RECENT ADVANCES IN MEDICAL AND VETERINARY MYCOLOGY. Kazuo Iwato, editor.

University Park Press, Baltimore, 1977. \$60.00

This book constitutes the proceedings of the Sixth Congress of the International Society for Human and Animal Mycology, held in 1975 in Tokyo. Subjects included in the papers presented are the recent advances in the status of immunology in the mycoses, in therapy of the mycoses, and of mycology and epidemiology of animal mycoses. This volume also contains contributions on advances in the mechanism of fungal infections, global problems due to opportunistic fungi, recent taxonomy of pathogenic fungi, fungal carcinogenesis and carcinostasis.

It is a welcome contribution by a number of experts of international standing in the field of human and veterinary mycology, and should have appeal to mycologists, immunologists, epidemiologists, and oncologists.
